
VOYAGE SPOTLIGHT:

THAILAND

The Map Tu Phut LNG terminal, operational since 2011, serves as an import and regasification facility for liquified natural gas (LNG). Positioned along the east coast of the Gulf of Thailand, between Sarrahip and Rayong, it stands approximately 220 km away from Bangkok, the Thai capital. With a nominal capacity of 11 million tons of LNG per annum (Mtpa), the terminal is equipped to accommodate vessels ranging from 125,000 cubic meters to 264,000 cubic meters in capacity. The facility features two storage tanks, each boasting a total capacity of 250,000 cubic meters.

Primarily sourcing gas from Qatar and Malaysia since its inception, the terminal has played a pivotal role in shaping Thailand's energy landscape. As of now, natural gas constitutes two-thirds of the fuel utilized in Thailand's electricity generation. The establishment and expansion of the Map Tu Phut LNG terminal have been instrumental in ensuring long-term energy security for the nation.

Throughout the years, the Map Tu Phut LNG terminal has undergone successful expansions, reinforcing its significance in meeting Thailand's growing energy demands.

INTERVIEW SPOTLIGHT: SALMAN AL-SAYEGH

Salman joined Nakilat as a Developee in 2012. He has had a chance to work with different divisions as a specialist in supply. In this issue, he will share his experience and expertise gained from two recent overseas assignments from the UK and Greece.

Reflecting on your career progression, can you share a specific instance where you encountered a significant challenge in your role, and how did you navigate through it to achieve success?

It has been important to explore new approaches for dealing with transactional activities without any impact on business. The aim was to enable the team to focus more on strategic items. It became achievable with taking some steps, such as: setting clear targets from the beginning and understanding the goal clearly. Then we involved concerned parties into a discussion and analysed different proposals. We put emphasis on assessing and mitigating possible risks. Finally, the monitoring was closed after the implementation, and we had to ensure that things are on the right track.

Having recently completed an international attachment, could you elaborate on key takeaways from this experience and how it has positively influenced your professional development?

Getting the opportunity to take an overseas assignment was an important step that helped with strengthening my technical and professional knowledge. It provided me with a better understanding of alternative ways for companies to handle projects, differences in terms of processes, systems in place and tools. I had a chance to benchmark between



maritime transportation companies with a focus on supply activities and why things are done differently.

Throughout your career, how have you approached building and maintaining effective professional relationships, both internally and externally, and how has this contributed to your success in your role as a Supply Manager?

As a specialist in supply, I handle internal and external communication. It is important to maintain professional relationships with a clear understanding of responsibilities and expected deliverables – to avoid ending up with a dispute case. We work closely with all parties to ensure a comprehensive scope and milestones are developed internally prior to approaching external parties. All the pre-arrangements are formalized and protect both parties' rights.

For young professionals aspiring to advance their career within Nakilat, what strategies or advice do you believe are crucial?

PHISHING SIMULATIONS: EXPLOITING THE CULTURE



We rely heavily on technology for both personal and professional communication, we are constantly bombarded with emails, texts, and social media messages. Unfortunately, not all of these messages are legitimate. Phishing attacks, where cybercriminals attempt to trick individuals into revealing sensitive information or clicking on malicious links, are becoming increasingly sophisticated and prevalent.

In a general definition, phishing simulation is a series of crafted exercises that mimic real-world phishing attempts, allowing employees to experience and learn from them in a safe and controlled environment. Phishing simulation is becoming an essential part of our cybersecurity awareness program due to a number of benefits:

• Increased awareness: by simulating real-world attacks, our employees

become more familiar with the tactics and techniques used by phishers.

- Improved decision-making: phishing simulations put you in realistic scenarios where you need to make quick decisions about whether to click on a link, open an attachment, or provide personal information.
- Reduced risk of data breaches: by raising awareness and improving decision-making, phishing simulations can significantly reduce the risk of our employees falling for phishing attacks and compromising sensitive data.

Phishing emails often create a sense of urgency, pressuring the recipient to act quickly without thinking. This can lead to impulsive decisions and a higher likelihood of falling for the scam. Phishers often impersonate legitimate organizations or individuals. This can play

on the natural tendency to trust authority figures and follow their instructions.

Phishing emails often offer too-good-to-be-true deals or threaten negative consequences if the recipient doesn't act. And finally, phishers are skilled at manipulating emotions and exploiting personal vulnerabilities. They may use flattery, guilt, or even threats to pressure the recipient into giving up their information.

Based on these psychological factors, Nakilat designs effective phishing simulations. They create emails that trigger the same emotions and thought processes as real phishing attempts, but without the risk of actual harm. It is a powerful tool for cybersecurity awareness. Remember, security is everyone's responsibility and when in doubts, please report using the phishing






